2015 100th Southwestern Amateur Tournament Summary

The 100th Southwestern Amateur was held June 10-13, 2015 at the par 70, 7272 yard Geronimo Course at the Desert Mountain Club in Scottsdale, Arizona. For the first two rounds, we also used the par 70, 6889 yard Cochise Course. This allowed us to accommodate the entire 156 player field in one morning wave. We used the same exemption approach as last year to improve the quality of the field. Exemptions were based upon rankings: on amateur events (top 500 in the Scratch Player World Amateur Ranking (SPWAR), top 200 in the World Amateur Golf Ranking (WAGR), on collegiate events (Golfstat and *Golfweek* Rankings, on junior events (*Golfweek*, AJGA), on Southwestern Amateur top finishers and past champions, and on special considerations. About 600 invitations were sent out in early January with those that replied affirmatively automatically accepted on a first in – first accepted basis. Our final field included 12 players from the SPWAR, 1 player from the WAGR, 5 players from the collegiate rankings and 41 players from the other categories. The field of 156 players, including 27 from California and 21 from Arizona, came from 29 states and 11 countries, and represented 80 colleges, universities and community colleges. GHIN's TPP program was our official scoring program. The web-based program Golfstat was again used for real-time scoring. Volunteers entered three-hole scores directly using Golfstat's smartphone application.

To celebrate the centennial, a luncheon and short ceremony was provided to all players and SWGA guests following the shotgun practice round on Monday. A Powerpoint scrolling presentation highlighted many of the tournament's champions, play and history. Speakers included the Desert Mountain Director of Golf Mike Scully, the Carefree Mayor Les Peterson, 1980's SWGA President Ron Sapper, three-time champion Scott Frisch, Arizona State University golf coach Tim Mickelson and Danny Calihan, Big Chief of the Phoenix Thunderbirds organization.

Dylan Healey of Franklin, Tenn. parred the first playoff hole to win the 100th Southwestern Amateur Golf Tournament over **Hayden Wood** of Edmond, Okla. Saturday afternoon at the Desert Mountain Club's Geronimo Course in northeast Scottsdale.

Healey (66-69-74-66) and Wood (68-69-68-70) finished the regulation 72 holes tied at five-under par 275, and returned to the 197-yard, par three eighteenth hole where Healey made a 10-foot putt for par, while Wood failed to get it up and down from the front green-side bunker.

"My back nine was what set up the entire round" Healey said. "I made five birdies on the back side with only one bogey. You certainly don't think about making three straight birdies at the end on this course." Healey, 21, a rising

senior at Cal-State University San Marcos, said Saturday's win "is certainly the biggest of my career. To be the 100th name on that trophy is pretty cool."

Wood – who began the day with a two-shot lead at five-under-par 205 – shot an even par 70 on Saturday, while Healey made three consecutive birdies on his last three holes to shoot a final round 66. Entering the final round, Healey trailed Wood by four strokes at one-under-par 209.

Eric Sugimoto (72-71-67-66) of San Diego finished third, one shot behind Healey and Wood at 276.

Round 1 Results - June 10

The 100th Southwestern Amateur Golf Championship got underway today under some early cloudy skies and mid-80's temperatures on the Cochise and Geronimo Courses at the Desert Mountain Club. Cochise played at 6889 yards, par 70 and Geronimo a bit longer at 7272 yards, par 70. **Jordan Gumberg** of Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, takes the first day lead firing a 64 (-6) on Cochise. **Dawson Armstrong** of Brentwood, Tennessee, shot 65 (-5) on Geronimo to take second. **Dylan Healy** of Franklin, Tennessee, **Jake Staiano** of Englewood, Colorado, and

Brandon Wu of Scarsdale, New York are tied in third place at 66 (-4). Thirty-five players of the 156 player starting field are at par or better. Arizona players in this group include William Comeaux, Blake Cannon, Mariano Rossi, Peter Kyo won Koo, Caston Roberts and John Souza.

Congratulations to **Clayton Crawford** of Aspen, Colorado, who had a hole-in-one on the 189 yard 11th hole on the Cochise Course.

The second round resumes at 7:30am tomorrow, Thursday, June 11th on both the Cochise and Geronimo Courses. Players are flipped so each play both courses. Upon completion of play, the field will be cut to those players with the lowest sixty scores and ties and continue play on only the Geronimo Course.

Dylan Healey Leads Second Round of 100th Southwestern Amateur Golf Tournament
By Two Strokes After Firing One Under Par Round of 69
Franklin, Tennessee Resident Heads Strong Field Competing on Cochise and Geronimo Courses at the
Desert Mountain Club in Northeast Scottsdale

Scottsdale, Ariz. – **Dylan Healey** of Franklin, Tenn. shot a one-under-par 69 on Wednesday to claim the 36-hole lead in the 100th Southwestern Amateur Golf Tournament being contested at the Desert Mountain Club in northeast Scottsdale.

Playing under partly cloudy skies with a slight wind, Healey gained momentum by eagling his 10th hole of the day (the 582-yard first hole) on the 7,293-yard Geronimo Course at Desert Mountain on his way to a five-under-par 135 score for 36 holes. He holds two-stroke advantage over **Hayden Wood** of Edmond, Okla. and **Kelby Scharmann** of Trabuco Canyon, Calif. who are tied at three under par 137.

Healey played "steady golf the entire day," with an eagle and two bogeys on front nine and eight pars on a birdie on the back." His 69 on Thursday backed up a four-under-par 66 on Wednesday on the 6,889-yard Cochise Course. "I really played a consistent round of golf today," the First Team NAIA All-American said. "I kept it out of the desert, and never even had to play a provisional ball all day. These greens are so pure that if you can keep it in play, you can post a good score on these courses."

The low round of the day – a 66 (-4) on Geronimo – was shot by **Perry Cohen** of La Jolla, Calif.

Sixty-eight players – fourteen from Arizona - advanced to the third and fourth rounds, with the cut coming at six over par 146.

The third round of the tournament resumes at 7:30 a.m., tomorrow, Friday, June 12 on the Geronimo Course with the leaders teeing off at 9:31 a.m. The final round will be played on Saturday.

Good Old 'Saturday Shootout' to Determine Winner of 100th Southwestern Amateur Nine Players Within Five Shots of the Lead as Tournament Enters Final Round; Edmond, Oklahoma's Hayden Wood Leads at Five-Under-Par 205

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. – A tightly bunched field with nine players within five shots of the lead will highlight the fourth and final round of the 100th Southwestern Amateur Golf Tournament on Saturday, June 13 at the Desert Mountain Club's Geronimo Course in northeast Scottsdale.

Entering tomorrow's final round, **Hayden Wood** of Edmond, Okla. stands at five-under par 205, two shots better than **Victor Lange** (69-71-67) of Johannesburg, South Africa and **Ryan Burgess** (69-73-65) of Rancho Santa Fe, Calif.

Playing in almost perfect conditions, Wood shot his third consecutive under par round (68-69-68) by playing "steady golf with four birdies and two bogeys" on the 7,272-yard-long Geronimo championship course. "Over the past three days, I have played very consistent golf and have managed my game quite well," Wood said. "With the tightly bunched field, I will have to play very well tomorrow to close the deal."

Wood, Lange and Burgess will have plenty of company in their quest for the coveted Southwestern Amateur title on Saturday. Three players – second-round leader **Dylan Healey** (66-69-74) of Franklin, Tenn., **Gregory Royston** (67-73-69) of Cambridge, Mass. and **Kelby Scharmann** (67-70-72) of Trabuco Canyon, Calif – are only four shots behind at one-under-par 209.

Three other players are at even par 210; **Nick Heinen** (70-74-66) also of Edmond, Okla., **Eric Sugimoto** (72-71-67) of San Diego, and **Aaron Whalen** (70-73-67) of Ephrata, Wash.

The fourth and final round of the resumes at 7:30 a.m., tomorrow, Saturday, June 13 with the leaders teeing off at 9:31 a.m.



With Healey already in the clubhouse, Wood came to the final hole needing only to bogey to win 100-year-old tournament. However, his tee shot went wide left, hit a spectator and was not found. His second shot from the tee came to rest in the front bunker where the son of Senior PGA professional Willie Wood was able to get the ball up and down for a double bogey five forcing the one-hole sudden death playoff.

Healey, 21, a rising senior at Cal-State University San Marcos, said Saturday's win "is certainly the biggest of my career. To be the 100th name on that trophy is pretty cool."

Eric Sugimoto (72-71-67-66) of San Diego (left) finished third, one shot behind Healey (middle) and Wood (right) at 276.

Healey joins a distinguished list of Southwest Amateur winners, including PGA professionals Jay Haas, Mark O'Meara, Corey Pavin, Ted Purdy and Nick Watney.

The twenty-nine players who finished in the top 25 will have exempt status into the 101st Southwestern Amateur which will return to the Desert Mountain Club next year.
