2017 102nd Southwestern Amateur Tournament Summary

The 102nd Southwestern Amateur was held June 14-17, 2017 at the par 70, 6883 yard Cochise Course at the Desert Mountain Club in Scottsdale, Arizona. For the first two rounds, we also used the par 70, 7171 yard Geronimo Course. This allowed us to accommodate the entire 156 player field in one morning wave. We used the same exemption approach as last year to improve the quality of the field. Exemptions were based upon rankings: on amateur events (top 500 in the Scratch Player World Amateur Ranking (SPWAR), top 200 in the World Amateur Golf Ranking (WAGR), on collegiate events (Golfstat and Golfweek Rankings, on junior events (Golfweek, AJGA), on Southwestern Amateur top finishers and past champions, and on special considerations. About 600 invitations were sent out in early January with those that replied affirmatively automatically accepted on a first in - first accepted basis. The field quality stats from SPWAR for 2017 were up substantially from last year (149 versus 92). This gets the event into the top 100 as of now (#93). It is likely to remain in top 100 when SPWAR's next update the event ranking after the US Amateur. As such, the SPWAR points awarded went from 235 to win through 21 spots to 330 to win through 27 spots (24 & ties). All players in the top 24 & ties were already in the SPWAR. The field stats get the Southwestern Amateur back on the world calendar. (Note from SPWAR: The Southeastern Amateur ended vesterday with their field stats going down to very close to what the Southwestern had last year. In other words, you swapped places with that event plus some.) The field of 156 players came from 220 entries and included 30 from California and 24 from Arizona. Players came from 30 states and 14 countries, and represented 86 colleges, universities and community colleges. GHIN's TPP Online program was our official scoring program and included OnCourse scoring for real-time scoring. Volunteers entered three-hole scores directly using TPP Online's smartphone application.

ARIZONA STATE'S JINO SOHN SHOOTS FINAL ROUND 66 TO CAPTURE 102nd EDITION OF SOUTHWESTERN AMATEUR GOLF TOURNAMENT

Sun Devil Junior Fires 14-Under-Par 266 to Win by Four Strokes Over Three Others; Becomes First Sun Devil Player to Win Prestigious Tournament Since 1989

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. – Arizona State University junior **Jino Sohn** shot a final round four-under-par 66 on Saturday to capture the 102nd Southwestern Amateur Golf Tournament at the Desert Mountain Club's Cochise Course in northeast Scottsdale.

Sohn (67-66-67-66-266) finished the tournament at 14 under par, four shots better than **Sean Carlon** (69-72-66-63-270) of Albuquerque, N. M., **Chase Hanna** (65-67-69-69-270) of Kansas City, Kan., and **Blake Hathcoat**

(69-66-70-65-270) of Fresno, Calif.

Once again on Saturday, Sohn got off to a blistering start, birdieing three of his first four holes (Holes 1, 2 and 4), repeating his performance of Friday that helped forge a one-shot lead entering the tournament's final round. "I knew coming into today's round that even par would not get the job done," Sohn said, "so I tried to control my emotions and got off to another good start. I bogeyed the fifth hole, but came back with another birdie from five feet at the sixth hole, before doubling the par-three seventh when my tee shot came up short and went into the water." After parring the eighth and ninth holes, the soft-spoken native of Honolulu made three birdies (Holes 10, 11 and 18) on the back side to secure the victory, fending off first-round leader Quade Cummins who shot a front-side five-under-par 30 to tie Sohn at the turn. Cummins faded on the back side, shooting a six-over-par 41 to finish at five-under-par 275, in a tie for ninth.

Sohn – who won the 2015 Arizona State High School Championship at Hamilton High School -- becomes the second consecutive winner of the tournament from Hawaii, joining last year's champion, P. J. Semiere of Kialua. He also is the first Arizona State University Sun Devil player to win the prestigious championship since 1989 when Scott Frisch won his third consecutive (1987-89) Southwestern Amateur title.

Sohn said the win comes "at a great time for me as I look ahead to my summer schedule. I really did not finish my college season that way I wanted to, but I am hoping that this victory will get me into a number of big

events later in the year. I really need to give a lot of credit to our coach Matt Thurmond who showed a lot of confidence in me at the end of the spring season. It helped my confidence and I am sure played a big role in this victory."

Carlon – who started the day well back at three-under-par 207 – shot the round of the day with a seven-under-par 63 that included a double bogey five at the seventh hole.

The field of 67 players played under clear skies, hot temperatures approaching 105, and almost no wind. Thirty-two of the 67 players who made the cut shot par or better for the 72-hole event.

Quade Cummins Matches Geronimo Course Record Seven-Under-Par 63 to Seize First Round Lead at 102nd Southwestern Amateur

Oklahoma Sophomore Holds Two-Stroke Lead Over Chase Hanna of Kansas City Entering Thursday's Second Round at Desert Mountain in Scottsdale

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. – **Quade Cummins** of Weatherford, Okla. shot a seven-under-par 63 (32-31) Wednesday to hold the first-round lead in the 102nd Southwestern Amateur Golf Tournament being played at the Desert Mountain Club's Geronimo and Cochise courses in northeast Scottsdale.

Cummins, a sophomore communications major at the University of Oklahoma, made seven birdies and no bogies, to tie the competitive course record on the 7,293-yard Geronimo Course. He holds a two-stroke lead over **Chase Hanna** of Kansas City, Kan. who shot a five-under-par 65 (31-34) on Desert Mountain's 7,042-yard-long Cochise Course.

After the first round -- played under clear skies with warm temperatures – Cummins leads a tightly-bunched field that features some of the country's leading amateur players. Playing the back nine first, Cummins' record-tying round featured seven birdies and no bogies and was highlighted by two long birdie putts on the 424-yard (par 4) 10th hole and 489-yard (par 4) second hole.

Also in close pursuit only three strokes back was **Jamie Cheatham** of Rancho Santa Fe, Calif. who shot a four-under-par 66 (34-32) on Cochise. Seven players are tied for fourth at three-under-par 67, including Jino Sohn, a junior at Arizona State University, Jake Chanen of Phoenix and Grand Canyon University, and Briggs Duce of Sierra Vista, Ariz.

Cummins, who played on Oklahoma's 2017 NCAA championship team, said his round "was very steady as I hit all 14 fairways and missed only two greens. It really was a very solid round of golf, on a very difficult golf course. I hope I can go out and to the same thing tomorrow."

The shot of the day came from **Kyle Suppa** of Honolulu **who aced** the 193-yard seventh hole on Geronimo.


CHASE HANNA HOLDS SLIM ONE-STROKE LEAD AFTER TWO ROUNDS OF 102ND SOUTHWESTERN AMATUER AT SCOTTSDALE'S DESERT MOUNTAIN

University of Kansas Star Stands at 8-Under-Par Entering Third Round to Lead First-Round Leader Quade Cummins by One in Closely-Bunched Field

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. – **Chase Hanna** of Kansas City, Kan. carded a three-under-par 67 on Thursday to vault to the top of the leader board after two rounds of the 102nd Southwestern Amateur Golf Tournament being played at the Desert Mountain Club's Geronimo and Cochise courses in northeast Scottsdale.

Hanna (65-67-132), a University of Kansas graduate and the 2017 Big 12 Champion, stands at eight under par, and holds a slim one-stroke lead over first-round leader **Quade Cummins** (63-70-133) of Weatherford, Okla. and **Jino Sohn** (67-66-133), of Honolulu, a rising junior at Arizona State University.

Cummins – who shot an even-par 70 on Desert Mountain's Cochise Course after equaling the competitive course record of 63 on Geronimo during Wednesday's first round -- and Sohn will join Hanna on Friday in the final grouping off the first hole on the Cochise Course.

The second round was played under clear skies with temperatures approaching 100 degrees with slight winds.

Hanna -- who played his second round on the difficult Geronimo Course -- leads a tightly-bunched field heading into the third round. "My 67 today was a little deceiving," Hanna said, "considering I did not play the par fives very well. While I did play a bogey-free round, I did not putt as well as I did yesterday, but my ball-striking was still pretty solid with birdies on holes, 15, 3 and 9. Hopefully, I can keep it going for the next two days." Cummins said his second round "was really a little spotty. I had to work hard today to hit fairways and greens, and I just did not hit it close enough to make many putts. It wasn't a great ball-striking round, but I am most definitely still in the golf tournament with a good chance to win if I can put two good rounds together on Friday and Saturday."

Sohn also was "a little disappointed in my round, since I made five birdies (on holes 6, 7, 9, 13 and 15) and an eagle (18), but I gave strokes back with a bogey on eight and a double bogey on 12. Those two hiccups prevented me from going really low."

Entering the third round, six players are within four shots of the lead, including Blake Hathcoat (69-66-135) and Peter Kuest (67-68-135) both of Fresno, Calif., and Colin Prater (67-69-136) of Colorado Springs, Colo. and Kyle Suppa (69-67-136) of Honolulu who are tied for sixth.

For the second consecutive day, tournament followers were treated to a **hole-in-one** when **Yash Majmudar** of Singapore sank an eight iron on Geronimo's 172-yard-long eighteenth hole. On Tuesday, Suppa aced the 193-yard seventh hole on Geronimo.

Sixty-eight players made the 36-hole cut that came at four-over-par 144, with a total of 27 players shooting even par or better.

SUN DEVIL JINO SOHN SHOOTS THREE-UNDER-PAR 67 TO TAKE THIRD ROUND LEAD OF 102ND SOUTHWESTERN AMATEUR AT DESERT MOUNTAIN

ASU Junior's 10-Under-Par Score Provides Him with One-Shot Lead Over Kansas City's Chase Hanna Entering Saturday's Final Round

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. – Arizona State University junior **Jino Sohn** shot a three-under-par 67 on Friday to take the third-round lead of the 102nd Southwestern Amateur Golf Tournament being played on the Cochise Course at the Desert Mountain Club in northeast Scottsdale.

Entering Saturday's fourth and final round, Sohn (67-66-67-200) sits at 10 under par for the tournament and holds a one-stroke advantage over second-round leader **Chase Hanna** (65-67-69-201), the 2017 Big 12 Champion from Kansas City, Kan.

Sohn, the 2015 Arizona high school champion from Hamilton High School in Chandler, got off to a hot start on Friday recording four birdies on the front nine (holes 1, 2, 4 and 7) in route to a front side 32, and then proceeded to shoot an even-par 35 back nine for his third consecutive round in the 60s.

"I played almost perfect golf for the first seven holes," the Honolulu native said, "making birdies on three of my first four holes. Then I birdied the seventh hole when I hit it to about five feet on the par three, but I bogeyed my eighth when I hit it into a bush and had to take an unplayable lie. Then I compounded my error by taking a bad drop which resulted in a penalty stroke. All in all, it was a pretty good six. I played a pretty solid back nine, with one birdie and one bogey, but I wasn't happy with my 19 putts."

The field of 67 players encountered clear skies with a slight breeze wind and temperatures in the low 100s.

Hanna – a recent University of Kansas graduate – got off to a slow start, shooting a three-over-par 38 on the front side, but rebounded with two birdies (holes 14 and 16) and an eagle on the par 5 18th, to finish at one-under 69. "I got off to an extremely bad start," Hanna said, "but I fought hard to bring it back on my second nine with six threes on my card. To be honest, I am very happy with my 69."

First-round leader **Quade Cummins** (63-70-71-204) of Weatherford, Okla., **Peter Kuest** (67-68-69-204) of Fresno, Calif., and **Andy Spencer** ((71-66-67-204) of Prairie Village, Kan. are tied for third at six-under-par entering Saturday's final round.

Sohn said he has a simple strategy as he looks forward to winning the biggest tournament of his career. "I am just going to go out and keep it very simple, trying to hit fairways and greens, and make as many putts as I can. That approach has worked so far for three rounds, so there is no reason to make any big changes."

The tournament continues Saturday morning with tee times beginning at 7:30 a.m. off the first and 10th holes on Desert Mountain's Cochise Course. The leading group tees off number one at 9:31 a.m.

Final thoughts

The twenty-five players who finished in the top 25 will have exempt status into the 103rd Southwestern Amateur which will return to the Desert Mountain Club next year.
