

2023 108th Men's Southwestern Amateur Tournament Summary 2023 3rd Women's Southwestern Amateur Tournament Summary

The 108th Southwestern Amateur was held June 14-17, 2023, on the Cochise Course at the Desert Mountain Club in Scottsdale, Arizona. This was the 3rd year for a women's division. Our 2022 champions Davis Bryant and Camille Boyd returned to defend. 72 men completed on the par 72, 6930-yard layout while the 65 women competed with the same par at 6010 yards. The first two rounds were played in morning and afternoon waves, the men and women alternating waves. For the third and fourth rounds after the 36-hole cut, play was in a morning wave only. So that division leaders would finish play at nearly the same times, both the 1st and 10th tees were used, the men off the 1st tee and the women off the 10th tee for the third round and vice-versa for the final round. Golf Genius was our official tournament program and included on course, real-time scoring. Volunteers entered three-hole scores directly using the Golf Genius smartphone application.

Beside our November Save the Date flyer and attendance at the December Coaches Conference (GCAA), our recruiting effort again concentrated on college golf coaches of programs west of the Mississippi (PAC12, Big 12, Mountain West, etc.). Coaches were told that players who they selected would be automatically invited. Additionally, approximately 200 top WAGR men and 300 women were sent invitation emails in early January with those responding automatically accepted on a first come-first serve basis. For those players who we did not have emails for, we contacted their coaches. Interestingly, 10 of 30 men's coaches contacted picked a player, while no women's coaches did.

Exemptions for the Women's Division were based on rankings: in amateur events (top 300 in the World Amateur Women's Golf Ranking [WAGR], Women's U.S. Amateur and Arizona Women's Stroke Play); in collegiate events (Golfweek and Golfstat rankings), in junior events (Golfweek, AJGA), top 15 & ties in the 2022 Southwestern Amateur Women's Division, and special considerations including the reigning Desert Mountain Women's Club Champion.

The Women's Division of 65 players from 91 entries (26 withdrawals), ages 14-40, came from 38 colleges, 18 precolleges, 17 states, and 10 countries, WAGR's ranged from 82 (Ashley Menne) – 2932. 40 were ranked in WAGR with an average of 1381. Our WAGR power ranking (strength of field) was 348 (in 2022 it was 490).

Exemptions in the Men's Division were based on rankings: in amateur events (top 200 in the World Amateur Men's Golf Rankings [WAGR], top 200 in the Scratch Players Men's World Amateur Rankings [SPWAR] and comparable exemptions, as noted for women, in other men's amateur, collegiate and junior events); top 15 finishers in the 2022 Southwestern Amateur and past champions and top players in the final 2022-23 Troon Saguaro Series and special considerations including the reigning South Beach International Amateur Men's Champion.

The Men's Division of 72 players from 208 entries (28 withdrawals), ages 17-71, came from 48 colleges, 11 precollege, 21 states, and 8 countries, WAGR's ranged from 155 (Davis Bryant) – 4248. 46 were ranked in WAGR with an average of 2208. Our WAGR power ranking (strength of field) was 214 (in 2022 it was 191).

There was no organized host housing again this year. Players dealt directly with hosts.

IN FINAL-ROUND COMEBACK, DAVIS BRYANT REPEATS AT 108TH SOUTHWESTERN AMATEUR

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. – Thirty-nine women and forty-seven men competed on the final day of the 108th Southwestern Amateur. **Davis Bryant** (Aurora, Colo. / Colorado State University) shot a 6-under 66 to come from five shots back and successfully defend his title at the Desert Mountain Club's Cochise Course in Scottsdale, Arizona. He becomes the first player to repeat as Southwestern Amateur Champion since Scott Frisch, who ground out a three-peat between 1987-89.

For three rounds and 13 holes on Saturday, the field looked up at Louisiana State University's **Luke Haskew** (Baton Rouge, La.).

Haskew came into the final round with a seemingly comfortable five-stroke lead on Bryant. Having to make up that many strokes with just 18 holes remaining, Bryant knew as well as anyone that he would have to play well and catch some breaks to repeat as champion.

Bryant did play well enough to remain in the hunt, carding the second-low round of the day; he caught his break as Haskew shot a rollercoaster round and finished even par. With the men's division starting on hole 10, Bryant's birdie on hole five (their 14th hole of the day) tied things.


Still tied with two holes remaining, Bryant caught another break when he and Haskew fired tee shots into the desert on hole eight; Bryant punched it out and eventually saved par, while Haskew settled for a bogey that proved to be the coup de grâce to his championship hopes.

"Starting five back, it's an uphill battle. But I started off really strong, I stuck to my game plan, I didn't do anything differently today than I did (in previous days)," Bryant said. "I knew I could make seven or eight birdies out here and the bogey on 17 was my only hiccup. I just stayed with what I was doing the first three days and the golf gods helped me out. My putter was really hot, too, so that was a plus."

It was the second-straight comeback win for Bryant at the Southwestern Amateur. Last year, he started the final round two shots back and closed with a 68 on the Geronimo Course for a two-shot victory.

Bryant finished at 22-under 266, one shot ahead of Haskew, who had not made a 6 all tournament until bogeying both par 5's on the final nine. **Brandon Shong** (Australia / University of New Mexico) and **Dylan Oyama** (Carlsbad, Calif. / San Diego State) tied for third at 16 under, five shots behind Haskew. **Jimmy Dales** (Northville, Mich. / University of Wyoming) was fifth at 13 under par.

Costas Panay (Redmond, Wash. / Cal-Berkeley) shot the round of the day, an 8-under 64, to finish sixth at 12 under.

SOPHIE ZHANG-MURPHY FLIPS THE SCRIPT, WINS SOUTHWESTERN WOMEN'S AMATEUR

Sophia Zhang-Murphy (Saratoga, Calif.), a rising sophomore at Princeton University, shot a final-round 68, her fourth straight round in the 60s to win the Southwestern Women's Amateur at Desert Mountain Golf Club in Scottsdale. Ariz.

For three rounds on the Cochise Course at Desert Mountain, as in the Men's championship, the field looked up to a leader who was attempting to go wire-to-wire.

Reagan Zibilski (Springfield, Mo.) of the University of Arkansas entered the day with a one-shot lead over Zhang-Murphy, who made her first dent in Zibilski's lead when she chipped out of a ditch to a tap-in putt for birdie on hole four. From there, she continued to claw her way up the leaderboard, finishing with four birdies on the front nine. Meanwhile, Zibilski settled for an even-par scorecard at the turn.

That gave Zhang-Murphy a three-shot lead over Zibilski, and four over defending champion **Camille Boyd** (Yorba Linda, Calif./University of Washington). From there, Zhang-Murphy was able to play steady golf, shooting even-par on the back nine, although Boyd would make it close at the end with her own 4-under 68.

Zhang-Murphy bogeyed the par-3 17th hole to allow Boyd to pull within two, but Boyd's birdie finish on No. 18 was only enough to make the final margin one shot.

"Throughout this whole tournament, I've just had to focus on playing my own game, going one shot at a time," said Zhang-Murphy. "Everybody misses putts, everyone hits bad shots sometimes, so I was just keeping that in mind and moving forward."

Zhang-Murphy finished at 14-under 274, one shot ahead of Boyd and three ahead of Zibilski, who finished solo third after a final round 72. Her victory makes her the third champion since the introduction of the women's championship, joining Ching-Tsu Chen (2021) and Boyd (2022).

Ashley Menne (Surprise, Ariz.) of Arizona State was fourth at 10 under, while **Minori Nagano** (Tokyo, Japan) of the University of Oregon rounded out the top five at 9 under par. Menne and Nagano were the only players in the field other than the winner to shoot four rounds under par.

In all, 13 players finished 72 holes under par.

HASKEW TIES THE COURSE RECORD OF 62 TO LEAD THE MEN'S DIVISION ZIBILSKI FIRES A 64 TO TAKE THE LEAD IN THE WOMEN'S DIVISION

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. – The men teed off this morning to begin the first round of the 108th Southwestern Amateur Championship at Desert Mountain Club's Cochise Course in Scottsdale, AZ. The weather was about 85 degrees with little or no wind. There were 72 men and 65 women who teed off in morning and afternoon waves.

The men's division teed off in the morning wave. Baton Rouge, LA, native **Luke Haskew** tied a course record of 62 (-10). "I felt very relaxed out there and definitely swung it well. I'm pretty sure I hit every fairway and hit nearly every

green. Definitely a good ball striking day today," said Haskew. The LSU freshman begins the second round tomorrow at noon in the lead.

Four men share a tie for second place with a score of 65 (-7): Irvine, CA, native Caden McMackin, Aurora, CO, native and 2022 Southwestern Amateur Tournament winner Davis Bryant,

Northville, MI, native Jimmy Dales, and Sydney, Australia native Brandon Shong.

The women teed off in the afternoon wave. **Minori Nagano** from Tokyo, Japan had a hole-in-one at the 11th hole at 154 yards with a pitching wedge. "That was my first time I made a hole-in-one in the tournament, so I feel great."

Reagan Zibilski from Springfield, MO, leads the women with a score of 64 (-8). "The past few months I felt very close about my game, so to see it all come together is extremely amazing," she said. The sophomore at University of Arkansas had great expectations for herself in today's round. "I came in hitting good, my ball striking was good, and I was rolling the putter very well."

Grace Lee from Bellevue, WA, is in second place shooting a score of 66 (-6). Austin, TX, native **Bentley Cotton** sits at third with a score of 67(-5).

The second round begins with the first tee time tomorrow at 7:30 a.m. The women will go off in the morning wave and the men will go off in the afternoon wave at 12 p.m.

ZIBILSKI CONTINUES TO LEAD THE WOMEN'S DIVISION HASKEW CONTINUES LEAD, BUT SEVERAL PLAYERS HAVE NARROWED THE LEAD

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. - The women teed off to begin the second round of the 108th Southwestern Amateur Championship at Desert Mountain Club's Cochise Course in Scottsdale, AZ. The weather was about 87 degrees with wind. Cuts were made for the low 36 and ties of both the men and women who will advance to the final round...

The women's division teed off in the morning wave. Reagan Zibilski from Springfield, MO, continues to lead the women's division with a score of 64-68-132 (-12). "I knew it was going to be hard to follow up an eight under from yesterday, but I kept pushing and extended my lead to four," said Zibilski. The sophomore from University of Arkansas used her recovery methods and rest to bounce back from a late tee time, to an early start. Austin, TX, native who attends University of Texas Bentley Cotton sits in second place with a score of 67-69-136 (-8). Cotton is used to the humidity but enjoys the mild dry heat. Grace Lee from Bellevue, WA, and attends Gonzaga University, is in third place one shot behind Cotton, with a score of 66-71-137 (-7).

The men played in the afternoon wave. Baton Rouge, LA, native Luke Haskew holds a two shot lead, with a score of 62-68-130 (-

14). "The shots that you hit the round prior don't matter anymore. I have to stay in the present, stay relaxed, and continue to trust myself," said Haskew, a freshman at Louisiana State University. In his off time not playing the tournament, Haskew has visited family and looks forward to exploring Scottsdale. Defending champion and Aurora, CO, native Davis Bryant sits in second place with a score of 65-67-132 (-12). Scottsdale, AZ, native Joseph Lloyd sits at third with a score of 68-65-133(-11).

Round three will begin tomorrow morning at 7:30 a.m. using the first and tenth tees will be used. There were 39 women who made the cut at 150 (+6) and 47 men who made the cut at 145 (+1).

REAGAN ZIBILSKI AND LUKE HASKEW TRY TO GO WIRE-TO-WIRE AT 108TH SOUTHWESTERN AMATEUR

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. – After three rounds on the Cochise Course at Desert Mountain Golf Club in Scottsdale, Ariz.. Louisiana State University's Luke Haskew (Baton Rouge, La.) and University of Arkansas's Reagan Zibilski (Springfield, Mo.) lead the Men's and Women's divisions respectively, headed into the final round of the 108th Southwestern Amateur.


Both Haskew and Zibilski have led each of the first three rounds and will try to go for the wire-to-wire wins on Saturday.

Zibilski's third round was a tale of two nines; the rising sophomore struggled early, carding three straight bogeys. Although weather conditions have been ideal throughout the Southwestern, winds began to pick up as the lead groups made the turn. The breeze presented a challenge, but Zibilski canceled out her early struggles with three straight birdies. She finished her round with a double bogey and birdie on holes seven and eight, but maintains the top spot, despite a third-round +1.

[&]quot;I got off to a rough start. I was able to make a few birdies and get a few back," said Zibilski.

Princeton's Sophia Zhang-Murphy (-10) (Saratoga, Calif.) is in sole possession of second place, while defending champion Camille Boyd (-9) (Yorba Linda, Calif./University of Washington) finds herself in a three-way tie for third with Ryan Flynn (Truckee, Calif./Grand Canyon University) and Bentley Cotton (Austin, Texas/University of Texas) - all well within the hunt. Zhang-Murphy, Boyd, and Julia Misemer (Overland Park, Kan./University of Arizona) fired the day's best rounds on the women's side, with four-under 68's.

On the men's side, Haskew continues to ride the momentum of his courserecord-setting first round. Haskew, who now sits at 21-under for the tournament, grew his lead by three strokes with a 7-under, 65 on Friday.

"I feel like I struck the ball better today and I was able to let myself freely swing. I got off the tee very nicely," said Haskew.

Along with defending champion Davis Bryant (Aurora, Colo./Colorado State University) and Joseph Lloyd (Scottsdale, Ariz./Fresno State University), Haskew's pairing went nearly eye-for-an-eye through the front nine. No hole exemplified that better than hole three; all three competitors' approach shots landed in a row, inches apart on the green and all three sank downhill birdie putts.

Lloyd was the only member of the pairing who gained any ground on the front nine, but Haskew was unphased by the stop-start winds that emerged late in the day; he finished strong with three birdies in his final five holes to turn in the second-best score of the day.

Bryant and Lloyd (-16 through three rounds) both trail Haskew by five strokes. A few spots down the leaderboard, it was Reed Lotter (Savannah, Ga./Auburn University) who turned in the day's best score with an 8-under, 64; he sits in a five-way tie for T11.


