KRISTOFFER KUAAS WINS THE MEN'S DIVISION LEIGH CHIEN TAKES THE WOMEN'S DIVISION



2024 Champions Kuvaas and Chien

The 109th Southwestern Amateur was held June 12-15, 2024, on the Outlaw Course at the Desert Mountain Club in Scottsdale, Arizona. This was the 4th year for a women's division and the 1st year as a member of the Women's Elite Amateur Golf Series. Both divisions had full fields. 72 men competed on the par 72, 7107-yard layout while the 72 women competed with the same par at 6278 yards. The first two rounds were played in morning and afternoon waves, the men and women alternating waves using the 1st and 11th tees. For the third and fourth rounds after the 36-hole cut, play was in a morning wave only. For the 3rd round, women leaders were first off the 1st tee followed by the men's leaders. The remaining men were first off the 11th tee followed by the remaining women, and vice-versa for the final rounds so that men and women leaders finished on the 18th green. Golf Genius was our official tournament program and included on course, real-time scoring. Volunteers entered three-hole scores directly using the Golf Genius smartphone application.

Our recruiting effort again concentrated on college golf programs west of the Mississippi (PAC12, Big 12, Mountain West, Texas, etc.) but also had some success with programs in the Midwest, Southeast and East coast. Additionally, approximately 200 top WAGR men and 300 women were sent invitation emails in early January with those responding automatically accepted on a first come-first serve basis. For those players who we did not have emails, we contacted their coaches.

Exemptions for the Women's Division were based on rankings: in amateur events (top 300 in the World Amateur Women's Golf Ranking [WAGR], all exempt for current year's Women's United States Amateur and current year's Arizona Women's Stroke Play Champion); in NCAA Division I, II & III collegiate events (Scoreboard by Chippd); in junior events (Golfweek, AJGA); top 15 & ties in the 2023 Southwestern Amateur and past champions; reigning women's champions of the Desert Mountain Women's Club, the Sea Island Amateur, the North & South Amateur, the Western Amateur, the Ladies National Golf Association Amateur, and the Future Champions National Championship.

The Women's Division of 72 players from 145 entries (18 withdrawals), ages 16-44, came from 53 colleges, 17 states, and 11 countries, WAGR's ranged from 58 (Jeneath Wong) – 3034. 58 were ranked in WAGR with an average of 1031. Our WAGR power ranking (strength of field) was 467 (in 2023 it was 348).

Exemptions in the Men's Division were based on rankings: in amateur events (top 200 in the World Amateur Men's Golf Rankings [WAGR], all exempt for current year's Men's United States Amateur and current year's Arizona Men's Stroke Play Champion); in NCAA Division I, II & III collegiate events (Scoreboard by Chippd); in junior events (Golfweek, AJGA); top 15 & ties in the 2023 Southwestern Amateur and past champions; reigning champions of the Desert Mountain Men's Club, the South Beach International Amateur, and the Future Champions National Championship.

The Men's Division of 72 players from 208 entries (32 withdrawals), ages 16-32, came from 40 colleges, 12 states, and 8 countries. WAGR's ranged from 52 (Xihuan Chang) – 4448. 41 were ranked in WAGR with an average of 1548. Our WAGR power ranking (strength of field) was 210 (in 2023 it was 214).

There was no organized host housing again this year. Players dealt directly with the hosts.

KRISTOFFER KUVAAS SURGES TO WIN THE MEN'S DIVISION IN A PLAYOFF

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. – Forty women and forty-one men competed on the final day of the 109th Southwestern Amateur at Desert Mountain's Outlaw Golf Course concluded under sunny skies with temperatures rising from 86°F in the morning to 103°F by early afternoon. Winds around 9 mph with higher gusts added to the challenge.

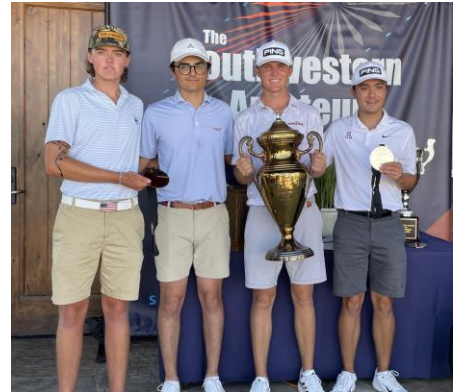
Kristoffer Kuvaas won the Southwestern Amateur men's tournament in a two-hole playoff over **Johnny Walker** after both players signed for 12-under-par 276 totals.

Kuvaas, a native Norwegian who lives in Houston, Texas, and is a sophomore at Pepperdine, began the final round five shots off the pace. He racked up 10 birdies (8 of

his last 11 holes) in posting a tournament-low 9-under 63 to tie Walker, who played his last 12 holes in 6-under.

"I had a nice round today so it feels good to get some validation," said Kuvaas. "My time at Pepperdine has been huge. I've learned so much playing my first year of college golf."

Walker, from Chandler who is going into his last year at the University of Arizona, finished second. **Jacob Goode** from San Francisco, California, and **Hunter Swanson** from Denver, Colorado, who plays for the University of Colorado, finished one stroke back at 11-under-par 277.

In all, 32 players finished 72 holes under par.

LEIGH CHIEN COASTS TO WOMEN'S DIVISION TITLE

Leigh Chien played bogey-free golf over the final 36 holes and cruised to victory in the Women's Division. Chien, a Stanford recruit from Irvine, California, closed with a 6-under 66 for a 14-under 274 total at Desert Mountain's Outlaw course.

"It feels amazing to win" said Chien, who will enroll at Stanford in the fall. "I haven't won in a while, so being back in the winner's circle feels great!"

Yu-Chu Chen from Allen, Texas, representing Taiwan, **Kendall Turner** from Chesapeake, Virginia, and a recent James Madison graduate, and **Huai-Chien (Cindy) Hsu** from Taiwan, a junior at the University of Texas, tied for second at 8-under 280. Both Chen and Turner shot a 67 with seven birdies against two bogeys.

The tournament is the second of five events in the [Women's Elite Amateur Golf Series](#).

Kaylyn Noh from Rocklin, California, who plays for the University of California, made a hole-in-one on the 6th hole, and finished T9 at 5-under 283.

In all, 20 players finished 72 holes under par.

**GOMEZ DOMINATES WITH BOGEY-FREE 66 (-6), LEADS WOMEN'S DIVISION
ROBISON, LEWIS, AND ENRIGHT SHARE MEN'S DIVISION LEAD WITH 68S (-4)**

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. – The 109th Southwestern Amateur Golf Tournament kicked off today at Desert Mountain's Outlaw Golf Course with stellar performances in both the women's and men's divisions.

Murrieta, California native **Lauren Gomez** set the pace in the women's division, shooting a flawless six-under-par 66. The Pepperdine student athlete's bogey-free round, highlighted by six birdies, gives her the sole lead among the 72 competitors. The women's division teed off with morning temperatures starting at a comfortable 80 degrees, reaching up to 98 degrees by the time they finished around noon.

Trailing Gomez is Taiwan's high schooler **Yu-Chu Chen**, who carded her own bogey-free 67 (-5), while **Madelyn Gamble** from Pleasant Hill, California, posted a 68 (-4) to secure third place. Gamble, who will be a senior at Washington State, had six birdies against just two bogeys for her round.

Notably, 25 players in the women's division finished the morning round at even par or better.

This year's women's division is part of the inaugural Elite Amateur Golf Series for women, a premier circuit of the most prestigious amateur golf tournaments in the United States.

In the afternoon, the men's division faced temperatures soaring to 101 degrees, with wind gusts up to 19 mph. Despite the challenging environment, three players rose to the top, each shooting a four-under 68 to tie for the lead. **Brandon Robison** from Centerville, Utah, **Trevor Lewis** from Prescott, Arizona and Longboat Key, Florida resident **Carson Enright** navigated the course with skill and adaptability.

Arizona native and UNLV's Trevor Lewis commented on the unique challenges of the desert heat, saying, "When it gets really hot, you still need to control your distance because the ball can go pretty far, especially here in the mountains." Brandon Robison from the University of Utah added, "The ball goes a long way when it's hot, which is nice because there are a few longer holes here." University of San Diego's Carson Enright, who grew up in Arizona and now resides in Florida, emphasized the importance of staying hydrated and maintaining energy levels. "Stay hydrated. Also keep eating because when it's hot like this people say to drink water but forget to eat. I made sure I kept eating and staying hydrated," Enright advised.

Six players are tied for fourth place, each with a score of 69 (-3).

The second round of the tournament begins tomorrow at 7:30 AM, with the men's division teeing off in the morning and the women's division starting at 12 PM. The women teed off in the afternoon wave.

KAMINSKI SURGES TO THE LEAD IN THE WOMEN'S DIVISION ROBISON AND WALKER TIED FOR MEN'S DIVISION LEAD AFTER DAY TWO OF THE SOUTHWESTERN AMATEUR

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. – Ideal weather conditions paved the way for impressive scores during the second round of the 109th Southwestern Amateur at Desert Mountain's Outlaw Golf Course.

In the women's Division, **Nicola Kaminski** of Los Gatos, California, surged into the lead with a two-day total of 8-under-par. She followed her opening 69 with a stellar 67, featuring six birdies and just one bogey. "I feel good about my game. I was pretty comfortable. My patience was tested at the beginning because I couldn't get putts to drop, but I just had to stay patient and trust that God had a plan for my round," said Kaminski, who attends San Jose State.

Madelyn Gamble from Pleasant Hill, California, sits one stroke back in second place after a roller-coaster round of 69, which included seven birdies and four bogeys. "I wanted to be committed and decisive while I was playing. I wanted to keep it simple because that's something I've worked on throughout the college season and in the summer as well," Gamble who plays for Washington State shared.

Taiwan's **Yu-Chu Chen** and **Lauren Gomez** from Murrieta, California, are tied for third at 6-under, two strokes behind Kaminski. Gomez plays golf for Pepperdine. **McKenzi Hall** from Las Vegas, Nevada and **Molly Smith** from Westford, Massachusetts, are both three strokes off the lead at 5-under.

Hall, a UNLV golfer, posted a strong 67 today, positioning herself well for the final two days. "I told myself to stay patient. Yesterday some of my shots weren't falling and it was frustrating. I told myself the shots would fall and then I started to make putts," Hall commented.

Smith, who attends UCF, noted, "I feel that overall, I am hitting it pretty well and I am managing my game pretty well around this course."

Ashley Menne, an Arizona State graduate and Surprise, Arizona native, shot the low round of the day with a 6-under 66, putting herself back in contention. "It feels great to be back at the tournament. I always enjoy playing Southwestern. I love supporting Arizona golf and it's a great course," Menne said.

A total of 40 women made the cut at +3 or better.

In the men's division, **Brandon Robison** from Centerville, Utah, and plays for the University of Utah, and **Johnny Walker** from Chandler, Arizona, are tied for the lead at 7-under-par. Walker, a University of Arizona golfer, reflected on his day, saying, "I was the last tee time off yesterday and the first one off today, so I pretty much went with the flow. There was not a break in between. The weather is more in my favor because I am used to it. It's me and the course, don't worry about other people."

James Roller from Jenks, Oklahoma (Kansas State), **Jack Dozer** from Phoenix, Arizona (University of Denver), **Ethan Wilson** from Canada (University of Illinois), and **Hunter Swanson** from Denver, Colorado (University of Colorado), are just one stroke behind at 6-under. Swanson recorded the lowest round of the day with a superb 65. "Yesterday I felt like I left a lot out there, the longest putt I made was a three-footer. Today I wanted to make a putt outside of three feet and I did it pretty early," Swanson noted.

KAMINSKI AND CHIEN LEAD WOMEN THE WOMEN'S DIVISION WALKER, WILSON, AND SWANSON TIED FOR MEN'S DIVISION LEAD AFTER DAY THREE OF THE SOUTHWESTERN AMATEUR

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. – The third round of the 109th Southwestern Amateur at Desert Mountain's Outlaw Golf Course saw challenging pin positions and increasing temperatures, starting in the mid-70s, and reaching the mid-90s, with winds averaging 5 to 8 mph and higher gusts in the early afternoon.

In the women's division, **Nicola Kaminski** of Los Gatos, California, shares the lead with **Leigh Chien** of Irvine, California, both at 8-under-par. Kaminski shot a 72, reflecting, "There were a lot of times I had to stay patient. I was struggling to make putts and trying to trust that they would drop. Statistically speaking, the putts will eventually go in." Kaminski attends San Jose State.

Chien, who will attend Stanford in the fall, posted a bogey-free 67, with five birdies, including back-to-back birdies on 13 and 14. "I'm really excited to play on a team since golf is such an individual sport. Playing on a team will be different, and it's something I'm looking forward to," Chien commented.

Huai-Chien (Cindy) Hsu from Taiwan, a junior at the University of Texas, also shot a 67, sitting one stroke back. Hsu made six birdies in a span of 10 holes between holes 4 and 13. "I try to hit every shot that my coach, who is also my caddy, gives to me and try to not think too much and just hit the shot that I want," Hsu shared.

Lauren Gomez from Murrieta, California, and **McKenzi Hall** from Las Vegas are tied at 6-under par. Gomez attends Pepperdine, while Hall plays for UNLV.

In the men's division, **Johnny Walker** from Chandler, Arizona, **Ethan Wilson** from Canada, and **Hunter Swanson** from Denver, Colorado, are tied for the lead at 8-under-par. Walker, who plays for the University of Arizona, battled back with three birdies in his last six holes to shoot 71 after taking a triple bogey on the 9th hole. "I've matured a lot and I don't let a lot get to me. Just get to the next step," Walker said.

Swanson, who plays at the University of Colorado, recorded a steady round with three birdies and one bogey for a 70. "It wasn't as great of a round as I had yesterday but it would've been hard to top that. I've been playing pretty steady consistent golf all day today. Never got in too much trouble," he remarked.

Wilson, who plays at Illinois, had an up-and-down round through 12 holes but found his rhythm with an eagle on the 13th and a birdie on the 16th to finish strong with a 70. "It's obviously unreal, perfect weather. It was a little windy today and I couldn't figure out which way the wind was going, but unreal weather, I love it," Wilson stated..

Brandon Robison from Centerville, Utah, sits in fourth place at 7-under. Robison plays for the University of Utah.

Cooper Humphreys from Canada who will play for Oregon State had the low round of the day with a 68, moving to 4-under for the tournament.

The final round continues tomorrow with the men's division teeing off between 7:30 AM and 8:30 AM, and the women's division between 8:30 AM and 9:30 AM.
